These are the highlights of what we did in the Philippines and Asia in 2014.

CMC PHILIPPINES

A. Crusade Evangelism

Notes:

- 1. We have broken the 100,000 barrier in terms of people ministered and saved in our crusade. The highest record was in 2009 when we ministered to 90,284 people in one year. The number of people healed in the healing lines were also unusually high last year.
- 2. With 368 churches planted last year (296 by the networks and 72 from the crusade) we have planted

about one church a day. This brings the number of churches that we have planted since 2006 (when we formally started CMC) to 2712.

- 3. Church planting training was one of our major focus last year with close to 3000 church leaders and Pastors being trained. We hope to see the training result translated to multiplication of churches in the coming years as we continue to follow through and mentor those that have been trained. Training will continue to be our main focus this year.
- 4. Motorcycles and horses were given last year to help our CMC leaders who are ministering in the mountains and tribal areas. These are needs that were identified and addressed by one of our Filipino CMC Board Member.
- 5. Another typhoon, typhoon Ruby, hit the Philippines last year. Its path was in the same general direction where typhoon Yolanda hit last 2013. Although it was not as strong as Typhoon Yolanda, Ruby also did a lot of damage. We responded by giving out cash assistance to CMC Pastors that were affected.

CMC ASIA

Two evangelistic crusades were done last year, one each in Myanmar and Cambodia. We continue to see doors opening and restrictions to the gospel being relaxed in Asia. We also saw the effectiveness of platform projects like water wells, toilets, school supplies, to the furtherance of the gospel.

We will pay more attention to Asia this year. As of this writing, I am now on a 9 nation tour in Asia with Fritz Cobrado, our CMC Asia Promotion and development director.

God bless you all and let me close with these verses: Philippians 1:3-5 I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now.
